This report covers the activities of Yayasan LaSallian Kuching (YLK) for the period 1st January 2018 to 31st December 2018.

II. GENESIS

YLK is a charitable organization established by some former students of St Joseph's School, Kuching and Sacred Heart School, Sibu on the initiative of the late Bro Albinus O'Flaherty, former principal of St Joseph's School Kuching and Sacred Heart School Sibu. It is a non-profit organization set up to promote the development of tuition and learning programme and character building for marginalized students irrespective of race and religion. The services provided by YLK has been approved by the Brother Visitor in Council of the De La Salle Brothers of Malaysia, Singapore and Hong Kong.

The objectives are:

- To maintain and promote the La Sallian education image.
- To provide funding for education programmes for the marginalized.
- To undertake YLK plan programmes as an independent concern.

III. REGISTRATION

YLK is registered with Registrar of Societies, Malaysia on 10th January 2004 with the Certificate of Registration number PPM/SK/(4) and registration number is 49-03-15.

YLK has been granted tax exemption status from Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri Malaysia under subperenggan 13(1)(a) Jadual ACP 1967, on 1st May 2015.

IV. MEMBERSHIP

The total number of membership of YLK is 28.

VI. COMMITTEE MEETING

As required by the constitution, YLK Committee held four meetings on the 30th June 2018, 15th September 2018, 22nd November 2018 and 23rd February 2019. In addition, the Chairman of YLK also held operational meetings with the office staff, supervisors and teachers. Scholarship-committee was formed to source funds and related resources to help needy YLK ex-students. Various Sub-committee meetings were held from time to time to monitor the progress of actions taken and new matters arising.

VII. OTHER IMPORTANT EVENTS.

a) 2018 Educators' Retreat

On 18th and 19th March 2018, YLK collaborated with Global Peace Foundation Malaysia to conduct a retreat for the educators from all ten centres for the first time. The objectives for this retreat are:

- Foster greater ownership among educators to take initiative in enhancing each centre's learning and address various challenges.
- Provide a venue for relationship building among educators of different centres, sharing of best practices and collaboration.
- On-going capacity building for educators to learn new skills and tools that would improve learning in the classroom.

b) Lasallian Family Day

On the 6th October 2018, two hundred students with Supervisors, Coordinators, parents and committee members gathered at Tan Sri Datuk William Tan Auditorium for the 6th Lasallian Family Day. We were pleased to have SMK St Joseph's Principal witnessing the event. The organizing Chair person, Madam Tiong Siew Ing welcomed and thanked the participants for their presence in this annual family day which was organized by the three La Salle Centres, St Joseph, BDC and Stutong. English storytelling was the main focus of the day to promote the English language in the centres. The joyful day ended with a family meal.

a) In 2018, YLK has ten centres and two English for Working Adults (EWA) classes with a total population of 269 students and 50 staff.





LA SALLE CENTRE, BUNAN





The students of this centre did quite well on the subjects especially on Mathematics and Science. However, a bit more effort was needed to improve their English Papers.


LA SALLE CENTRE, ENTUBUH

- a) By the end of 2018, there were ten La Salle Centres operating smoothly with an exception of one centre which was short of one voluntary Science teacher.
- b) There were a total of seventeen applications for St Joseph's Private School scholarships. The selection Subcommittee had selected two students for the scholarships 2019 and both were accepted by the School Board. YLK is grateful to them for their generosity

X. LA SALLE NEW CENTRE

At the request from the School Board of SK St. Andrew, the committee approved the opening of the new centre at Sungai Apong area on 22nd February 2019. The Headmistress of SK St. Andrew granted permission for YLK to use the school premise and facilities to conduct English and Mathematics tuition classes for the needy students.

XI. FINANCE

The statement of income and expenditure account for the financial year ending 31st December 2018 shows a deficit of RM 85,318.06. The Foundation will continue to seek financial assistance in ensuring the sustainability of our operations to benefit those needy children.

XII. APPRECIATION

The on-going operation and growth of the Foundation is a reflection of the good will of the donors who are always ready to help the marginalized in our society. Their contributions are worthy of praise. The Foundation hoped that they would continue to support and contribute financially for the sake of the needy children and the progress of the society.
