he seal can look miserable lying on rocks. It seems like a gigantic blob of useless fat and shapeless flesh. He appears not so much living as dying, without any energy or spirit, a kind of pathetic creature that inspires pity rather than admiration. But of course he is out of his element on the rocks.

All this sounds maybe too idealistic but, it can help us as teachers and supervisors to keep our dream alive... the dream to help the students cross the boundaries into a new life... to make learning a lifelong love.




