Speech of Mr. Peter Yap, the Chairman, during the Anniversary Dinner

Good evening, our guests Dr. Jeffrey and Angie Goh, Dr. Brian Lim and Michelle Lim, Mr. Ngu Lee Hieng, YLK committee members, supervisors and teachers, students and ex-students.

On behalf of YLK, I welcome you all to our 20th anniversary celebration.

YLK was founded by Brother Albinus together with some of his former students in 2002. It was approved by the Registrar of Societies as a non-profit organisation in 2004.

10 years ago, when I took over the chairmanship from Datuk Chris Sim, I was fully aware of the many challenges ahead of us.

First and foremost was fund raising. YLK runs on a budget of about RM300,000 annually to cater for the free tuition for students in II centres. Brother Albinus assured me that money would not be an issue.

Instead, I was given the task to set up a sustainable management system to continue providing tuition to the least, lost and last especially in the rural communities.

Tonight, as we celebrate our 20th anniversary, I am proud to say that we have not disappointed Brother Albinus in carrying out his vision and mission. Many of our alumni have completed their tertiary education in various fields and we have a few of them here with us tonight.

We also have a lot to be thankful for on this occasion. Firstly, we would like to express our gratitude to our sponsors, both corporate and individuals. Your generosity and continued support are what make it possible for us to continue making a difference to the lives of these students in the rural communities. Thank you.

We are also very grateful to our team of volunteer teachers, some of whom have been with us for more than 10 years. Thank you for your commitment.

Moving forward, we are confident that we can continue to help those students in need. We are happy that we have many more like-minded young volunteer teachers from the kampong joining us to continue our mission. We are now incorporating Information Technology into our lessons. Most centres have now been equipped with smart TVs to provide access to online resources. Hopefully in the not too far future, we can provide tablets for every student.

YLK has earned its reputation and credibility as a trusted non-profit organisation. I am confident that we will continue to be so because this is the work of the Holy Spirit in touching the hearts of so many people, and I believe that we are just the instruments in carrying out this work of love. Hopefully, by the grace of God, we will be able to continue with this work for many more years to come.

YLK 20th Anniversary was celebrated on a moderate scale on 15.12.2022. 80 people comprising benefactors, committee members, staff, students and alumni gathered for a dinner to celebrate the existence of the Foundation for 20 years (right). After singing the National anthem and "We are the Lasallians", dinner commenced. The Chairman, Peter Yap, after his speech, invited Dr. Lim Choon Yang, a founding member of the Foundation to share his involvement and experience on the birth of the Foundation. Dr. Lim recalled it had a humble start at its earliest state.



One day, he was called up by the late Br. Albinus to help the needy students who had no space to study at home in a village. Though never involved in the field of education, as an obedient student of the La Salle Brothers, he with a few others renovated a room for them to do their studies at night. To their surprise, many of these students could do well in the examination at the end of that year, with one of them scoring 5As in the UPSR. This unexpected result inspired them to initiate a foundation. In 2002, with financial help from many La Salle schools Old Boys, a free tuition centre was set up in the village. As time passed, when more free tuition centres were established, an office was set up to monitor the activities, and more new members were recruited to continue the vision and mission of the Foundation.

Besides this, it provided a conducive environment in the afternoon after school for me to learn to be independent and to build up my social skills. Beside the tuition centre was a kampung community fish pond with a hut at its centre that exists till this day. This was my favourite meeting place with my friends where we would bring and share some food while chit chatting at this peaceful and scenic pond. The fellowship we shared still lives vividly in my heart.

This holistic education prepared me well to study at University Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia (UTHM), Johor and I have since graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering with Honours. Currently I am serving with One Medicare Sdn Bhd as an Electrical Technical Executive at Sarawak General Hospital.



Last but not least, I urge parents to send their children to a La Salle centre wherever there is one. My gratitude to the YLK committee members, volunteers, the Alumni and donors for their good deeds and support which transform the lives of the new generation for the common good of the society.
